RE: SUBMISSION PERTAINING TO THE MANUFACTURING SUPPORT PROGRAMME (MSP) GUIDLEINES

We refer to the Manufacturing Support Programme (MSP) guidelines issued by the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (DTIC).

We understand the purpose of this document is to detail the guidelines for the MSP which are intended to enable enterprises to present their applications to the DTIC and further provide a framework for the DTIC to evaluate such applications.

We have studied the MSP guidelines and have set out our comments in a tabular format below for ease of reference:

Footnote (page 6)	Raw material from a manufacturing industry into another manufacturing industry	Is only raw material from manufacturing considered in the raw material inputs i.e. can we exclude raw material from agriculture?

5.2	The application must be submitted with the designated application window period,	Is the intention of the programme to open for applications at particular periods of the year?

6.3	the grant related to consultant fees/costs may not exceed R1 million	Assuming the consultant fees do not exceed R1 million, will the DTIC accept an application with competitiveness improvement activities only?
Non-qualifying	Costs	



8.1.13	Applicants that are already receiving support from other DTIC grants, do not qualify for support under MSP	If an applicant is undertaking an investment in two different plants, would the DTIC consider two separate applications for this applicant?
Legal Conditions		
10.1.3	Circumvention: Applicants receiving financial grant support from other government source(s) for the same assets and competitive improvement costs as those for which assistance is sought from the MSP.	On the basis that the DTIC grant is used to reduce interest on an Manufacturing Competitiveness Enhancement Programme (MCEP) loan, can these assets still receive MSP support given MCEP is a loan?
